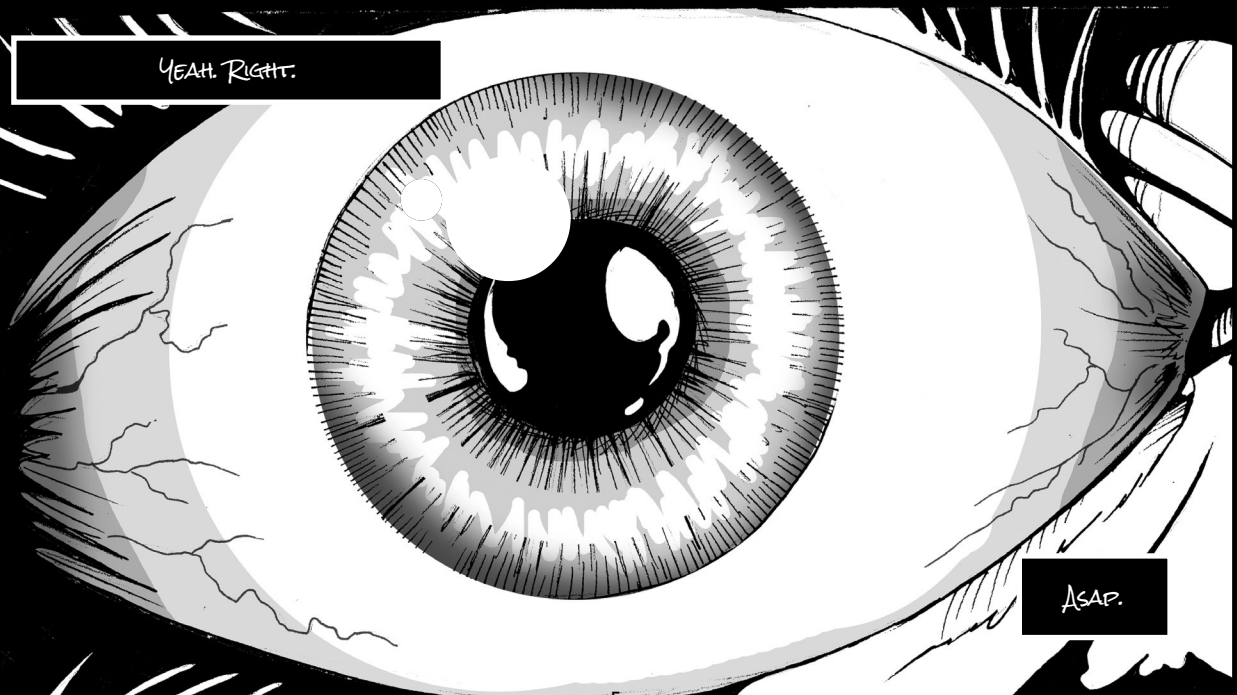


I'VE HEARD THAT EYES ARE THE MIRROR OF THE SOUL. SOME GROWNUPS SAY
