- Around 1975 Nakkula family verbal request to the Municipality of Keminmaa was made for support of the existing Smokehouse existence and in recognition of the local history legacy. This attempt did not gain support.
- Moral Level Obligation Proposal for the Regional Heritage History Preservation was made and noted in the **Municipality Memo #281/27.11.2019** when Nakkula project work was already in gear with Ely-center help of the Smokehouse repair work. The memo indicated that the discussions would continue, but the silence from Municipality has remained. The Smokehouse restoration and Nakkula Peasantry history work by the writer living in Canada has been since completed and presented in "**Juuresta Lähtien**" book in Finnish and the "**Roots**" book in English.

**Dedication with honors belongs alone to the Author's grandparent and specifically to the grandmother who was a Nakkula heritage farm family descendant.** Together they left Nakkula home place to their own grandson under obvious disapproval's of their own family. They did not change the decision even after the grandson moved to Canada. **They knew something others could not understand; the history will remember this.** The quality of the **grandparents'** extraordinary decision can be examined by a review of similar Peasant history stories preserved in the Scandinavian Lapland – **IF ANY.**

# PREAMBLE

## A Statement For The History Records

It is clarified that the **Comments and Views** in all Nakkula Series Project Books, in Finnish and English, are strictly related to the Peasantry History and Culture of Nakkula Heritage Farm Project (**Peasant Heritage History and the Book works**) based on the facts and findings. Writer's Personal observations and conclusions have been added based on extensive local and regional experience and the project facts rights and privileges to **expose and reinforce** the story background picture. *The work has been carried out to honor the writer's grandparent's heritage roots and the **original** Kemijoki River Historic Sigtuna Center heritage farm's work to stay with ancestral traditions, **based on which this truly exceptional and rare Lapland peasantry story became possible.***

Generally speaking, the importance and meaning of the Peasant History and Culture has been largely forgotten in the society and the subject is of a low interest to people. The Nakkula story series of books provide a possibility to select and read only a book or a section that may interest instead of all the three English books to learn something about the overlooked subject and the non-existing attention level by the society. Part 12 discuss this more.

The case study provided in the ref: **Root book Appendix N** turned out much valuable nationwide information on the Historic Peasant Culture and obvious lack of understanding of its Society Development Impact in Lapland. The State, by damming Kemijoki River at its mouth example has let the general population to misunderstand the facts. This has given fuel and support for history and cultural associations, village societies and individuals who, for reasons, do not want the subject to be recognized in the

# Salmon Rich Kemijoki River Deep Rooted History Overlook

"Juuresta Lähtien", "Roots" and "Peasantry of Lapland And Society Development" books focusing on the Peasantry along Kemijoki River were published. Ignorance and Neglect to the cultural heritage history became evident by **Country, Regional and Municipality Authorities, and the location Village**. The most Unique Peasant Heritage Story from Lapland ever published.

This book will not add to the Peasantry History already introduced in the **Roots book about Nakkula**, but it sees a fundamental need to focus and confirm lag of attention and moral support by society organizations typically involved, one way or other, in rare Heritage History projects. Peasantry, its history and culture with the root reasons for ignorance in the region **remains largely unknown**.

In the "Peasantry of Lapland and Society Development" book the following paragraph was included referring to the National and the responsible Regional Heritage History Authority actions to this project in its unique location:

*"Weird and economically four grade decision example for the country by the State was to dam Kemijoki River at its mouth. This was the death sentence of lover Kemijoki River Peasant History, destroyed European largest Salmon River, destroyed regions lifeline to its ancient way of life with Salmon, ended traditional river use and destroyed farmlands. As to the regionally connected Municipality Authorities there was nothing to turn attention to even when knowing well the existence of local Peasant History Blind Spot of which the shade is now off locally and in Scandinavia."* Realizing spread of this continuing National Level ignorance acceptance is clear, but stuns in this location with its history. The book will focus more in clear local reasons.

In this book it is then necessary to note about the actions and behavior of the **Municipality** and the local **Village** including the root facts of **far reaching legacy impact to the story development and now recordings in archives**.

With the above stated, it must be noted that the book series is based on a *Peasantry Heritage History Project* that is written by expatriate, ex-local heritage family farm home place owner only and **produced for the Peasantry History Records and future Practical References**. The stories in the books are complex, not scholarly-level works by "peasantry heritage history interest lacking University Researches". As such it may not be appreciated, **might be provoking and pervasive** and not to the likings of the regional and the local folks, **who did all possible to ignore the project in their backyard**. The books deal with a wide ranging issue's viewed from various perspectives. *History will understand the meaning of this Peasantry Heritage History and Culture story presentation, unusual in its way and total entirety with unknown facts.*
